Special Arrangement for Counter Services for Commemorative Stamp Issue “The 100th Anniversary of the Founding of the Communist Party of China” on 1 July 2021 (Thursday)

The 38 Philatelic offices will be open from 9am to 2pm on 1 July 2021 for the sale of philatelic products and provision of general postal services.

All mail items posted on 1 July 2021 will be processed on the following working day [i.e. 2 July 2021 (Friday)]. Mail items posted through street posting boxes, posting boxes of post offices, large letter and packet apertures in post offices would be serviced with the date-stamp of the following working day [i.e. 2 July 2021 (Friday)].

If the members of public would like to collect the date-stamp impression of 1 July 2021, they could drop their mail items with sufficient postage into collection boxes affixed with the specimens of the “Special Postmark” or “Pictorial Postmark” at the 38 Philatelic Offices, or proceed to counters for hand-back date-stamping service.

Postal Gallery in the General Post Office Features “Olympic Games”

A set of new exhibits on “Olympic Games” will be displayed at the Postal Gallery located on Ground Floor, General Post Office from **28 June 2021 to 31 August 2021**. The current exhibition on “Traditional Chinese Culture and Art” will end on 27 June 2021.

This exhibition presents a retrospective of stamps and philatelic products about “Olympic Games” issued by Hongkong Post since 1992, viz.

It also contains running sheets, stamps and associated philatelic products of the special stamp issue of “Games of the XXXII Olympiad Tokyo 2020” to be released on **23 July 2021**.
